

2024 March Elections FAQs

What elections are on the ballot on March 19th?

2024 Presidential Preference Primary Election (PPP) and Uniform Municipal Elections.

Please note: Some party candidates for president have reportedly suspended or ended their presidential campaigns. If a candidate did not submit a formal withdrawal before December 12, 2023, in accordance with section 103.101(3), Fla. Stat., the candidate nominee's name must remain on the Presidential Preference Primary (PPP) ballot for his or her respective party. A vote cast for any candidate nominee appearing on the ballot will count as a vote for that candidate. None of the seven candidate nominees on the ballot have filed withdrawal papers.

Who can vote in these elections?

This year, only the Republican Party is holding a PPP in Florida. Florida is a "closed primary" state; therefore, only voters registered with the Republican Party by February 20, 2024, are eligible to participate in the PPP.

All voters living within the following participating municipalities are eligible to vote in their municipal election:

Belle Glade • Boca Raton • Delray Beach • Greenacres • Highland Beach • Hypoluxo • Juno Beach • Jupiter • Inlet Colony • Lake Park • Lake Worth Beach • Lantana • Loxahatchee Groves • North Palm Beach • Ocean Ridge • Pahokee • Palm Beach • Riviera Beach • Royal Palm Beach • South Bay • Tequesta • Wellington • West Palm Beach

Additionally, the following municipalities will have annexation questions for voters in certain unincorporated areas of Palm Beach County:

North Palm Beach • Palm Beach Gardens • Wellington

How can voters cast their ballot?

- 1. By Mail
 - The deadline to request a mail ballot is 5:00 p.m. on March 7th.
 - Return postage is pre-paid. Drop it in the mail by March 12th or drop it off in-person at one of our four (4) offices, at a secure ballot intake station, or at any Early Voting location during Early Voting hours.
 - Vote-by-Mail ballots must be received by 7:00 p.m. at our Main Office on Election Day to count.
- 2. During Early Voting
 - There are 23 locations countywide open March 9th through March 17th, from 7:00 a.m. 7:00 p.m.
 - Any eligible voter in Palm Beach County can vote at any Early Voting location.
 - Visit VotePalmBeach.gov "Early Voting" for hours, locations and wait times, or to make an appointment.
- 3. On Election Day
 - Polls are open on March 19th, from 7:00 a.m. 7:00 p.m.
 - Voters must vote at the polling place that is assigned to their precinct.
